CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

The 2024 season was one of change. The beginning of the season ushered in a new Board and a new General Manager of the Parramatta District Junior Rugby League (PDJRL). These changes resulted from the comprehensive review of the Junior League undertaken by Gemba on behalf of the Parramatta National Rugby League (PNRL) Board.

That Review resulted in a number of recommendations that were accepted by the PNRL Board and are being substantially addressed by the new Board and management team.



The critical appointment of Adam Fairley to the role of General Manager PDJRL was undertaken and I'm sure that you would agree with me that he has 'hit the road running' and has been an outstanding success in the short time he has been with us.

Some important initiatives that your Board and Adam have introduced over the past season include:

- The launch of a new strategic plan for the Junior Leagues, in consultation with partner clubs for the period of 2023-2025.
- A modernisation of the Junior League Constitution, accepted by the member Clubs in October
- The introduction of online streaming of the 16/1's competition
- A very significant enhancement of our social media product, highlighting our member clubs, player and community work
- Extensive review and rewrite of the Junior League policies including, transfers, club affiliation and grading and regrading policies

The 2023 season saw an increase in registrations particularly for girls within our District. With a dedicated social media registration campaign to be executed for the 2024 season we look forward to that strong registration growth continuing.

In early November we conducted a day long review of the 2023 season with our member clubs. It was a great day with many constructive contributions made by club representatives which will only ensure that season 2024 grows and evolves positively on season 2023.

Our season culminated in fantastic Presentation Night held at the Daltone House, Marconi. Thank you to everyone that attended and contributed to making the night a success. Congratulations to all those that were recognised during that evening, including importantly, each of our Volunteers of the year from all clubs.

During visits to our grounds throughout the season, your Board witnessed strong competitions and also the great work undertaken by Club representatives to the success of those competitions.

Our competitions could not be conducted without the tireless effort of volunteers throughout our District. On behalf of your Board can I thank each of you that contributes to the day to day running of our member Clubs and game day. Our success and the continued enjoyment of our participants relies on those continued efforts.

Congratulations to all those competed during the season. Congratulations to those were successful in Grand Finals, Club Championships, those that gained representative honours and those that won individual Awards.



Thank you to Parramatta Leagues Club for their very significant contribution of \$360,000 to assist in the funding of our Clubs. Without this contribution registration fees would be substantially higher. Their continued support for junior sport, particularly rugby league is critical. GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

2023 was a tremendous season for the Parramatta Junior Rugby League.

It firstly needs to be acknowledged from an administrative perspective that long serving Junior League General Manager Matt Brady moved into Pathways on a full-time basis. We also had many Board of Management Members retire their positions after long tenures at the helm of the District - we genuinely thank Matt Brady, Warren Hamilton, Wayne Smith, Anthony Jones and Hayley Buck for their service to our District.

Four newly Elected Directors in James Power, Craig Shannon, Az Alabdallah and Michael Karam joined long standing Directors Jan Bryen and Elias Saab. Rob Morey continued as the Referees Association representative and Mark Jenkins joined as the Parramatta NRL representative and was as elected President by his peers.

During the season long standing Director Elias Saab tendered his resignation We also thank Elias for his dedicated service to our District.

From a staff perspective, Jan Bryen continued in her role as Junior League Administrator and Tina Bialluch was promoted to run Junior League Operations. Tim Gray was employed as our Multimedia Coordinator, while I was hired in the role of General Manager.

The Parramatta Junior League is blessed to have a united Board and Staff whose sole focus is to deliver the best Competition and Experience possible for our stakeholders.

Our year started with the Under 6s Fun Day at CommBank Stadium, and coincided with the Junior League Season Launch. The day is a wonderful experience for the kids and their parents inside the inner sanctum of the Parramatta Eels.



With the presenting of a jersey, a change room tour, meet and greet with NRL and NRLW stars, a run out onto the hollowed turf while being clapped on by Club representatives, followed by on field skills drills and finally jumping castles and face painting, it is truly an eye opener for new participants.

In 2023 we worked in line with the recommendations from the 2022 Gemba Report into the administration of the Junior League and we will continue to do so over the foreseeable seasons.

We worked hard during the year to best promote our players and clubs and we were able to achieve great results through a number of initiatives.

The Under 16 Division 1 Match of the Round Livestream was embraced by the teams involved in the competition. The initial media day, our game days, the after-match interviews and the Final's Teams Podcast were all undertaken in an enthusiastic and professional manner.

We would like to thank all clubs, coaches & players in the competition for making the promotion of the Central West Conference first class.



No matter how good the product is on the field you need a great commentator to describe what is happening. We were lucky enough to engage Lewis Shepperd to commentate our games. His passion for rugby league, his willingness to learn about each individual player including how to pronounce their names and his regular communication with coaches shone through in our broadcasts and in the after game interviews.

Our other social media initiatives provided wide ranging content across many age groups in the District. The Eels Coaching Reels, Under 16s and Under 18s Highlights, the Try of the Week and Little League Legends showcased our Junior League like never before.

We also provided some behind the scenes stories that received great coverage, comments and reached thousands of people. Obviously, those stories cannot be told unless our people are willing to be a part of it, we thank the All Saints Toongabbie Boys from Goodooga, those that attend the Cabramatta Homework Club, the teams that competed in the Paea Cup, our League Tag Players and the Clubs that told us about the special days they were hosting.



We celebrated our Under 7s completing the TackleReady program by hosting a Gala Day at Old Saleyards Reserve. It was a day full of cheers and smiling faces on the field and long queues to eat fairy floss and play in the jumping castles to the sounds of the DJ.

Our NRL and NRLW players visited our Clubs in two separate segments over the year. We thank the players for their time engaging with our Junior League Clubs, Coaches and Players.

The NRL worked with the Parramatta Junior Rugby League to provide attendees at two separate events during the year. The NRL conducted a Community Campaign at Kellyville Memorial Park, which included clinics conducted by the Game Development Officers and some live crosses to the Today Show. All of our Clubs were able to be represented by their players in what was a successful campaign. Our female participants were also invited to attend the Ampol Womens' State of Origin Series Launch at CommBank Stadium. This was a great opportunity for our females to rub shoulders with their idols and to promote themselves and their Clubs to a broad audience.



At the Round 9 home game at CommBank Stadium the Parramatta Eels hosted a Junior League Takeover. Each of our Clubs were represented by a flag bearer and five player representatives. This was a great showcase of our Junior League and the kids enjoyed the experience in front of a big Friday night home crowd.

Throughout the course of the season our Junior League Clubs were provided the opportunity for their Mini & Mod teams to play at half time on CommBank Stadium. This is a great thrill for the players involved to play on the Stadium surface and to play in front of a large and vocal crowd who really gets into the spirit when our teams are playing.

We are blessed in the Parramatta Junior League that three of our Clubs conduct all abilities programs. We will have a focus in our 2024 registration campaign on making families aware that these opportunities exist within our Association. We thank Wentworthville United, Hills Bulls and Mounties for their support of all abilities players.

During the Finals Series' we were out and about interviewing our Minor Premiers and getting some vision of their training sessions. We thank all clubs and teams for participating in this initiative and thanks to those clubs that moved team training sessions so that multiple Minor Premiers from their Club trained on the same ground at the same time.

From a Governance perspective we have released a Strategic Plan and made amendments to our Constitution. Thank you to all persons who sat on the Committees to construct the Plan and the Constitution changes and to the Club Delegates for accepting the changes made to ensure we are running under a modern Association model.

The Junior League received monetary support from Parramatta Leagues through ClubsGrants Funding. The funds received pay for a range of initiatives including Player and Club Insurance, Match Balls, Officials and Players Vests, Referees Fees and the Coaching of Junior Referees. This contribution of over \$350,000 reduces an individual players cost to play by over \$35. This amount effectively stays in the pockets of our Clubs, which allows them to purchase their own equipment and undertake other Club functions.



We thank Parramatta Leagues Club President Greg Monaghan and his fellow Directors and Chief Executive Officer Chris Dimou and his staff for their valued contribution to our Junior League.

Trivett Subaru are also a major sponsor of the Parramatta Junior League, supplying a car for a raffle the last three seasons which has seen in excess of \$90,000 received by our local Clubs. We thank Renee Pappas and the rest of the team for their valued contribution.

I would like to thank our Presidents, Secretaries and Club Committees for all of the work they undertook with their Clubs in the 2023 season. The added position of a Member Protection

Information Officer and the need for Clubs with teams aged 13 years and over to have their matches recorded on a VEO Unit required extra work during the season and we thank Clubs for their compliance with these functions.

On the park our registration numbers grew to 2019 levels. We had just over 5,500 players registered. While our male participation numbers are still building up to 2019 levels our female registrations are exploding. This season we had 970 female players, which was an increase of 50% year on year. The Junior League will continue to work with Clubs to introduce female participants to our game whether it be through traditional tackle competitions or League Tag. This season we had 224 teams aged U6 to U12 across our Saturday and Sunday Competitions and 126 teams aged 13 and older across our Tackle and League Tag Competitions. Those



teams played in over 2,400 games either in local, conference or metro competitions.

We thank those that set up the grounds, served in the canteen on roster, cooked the BBQ, acted as Ground Managers, drove their kids to training and the games or volunteered their spare hours to coaching, managing or being a trainer.

Congratulations to all our competitive teams who won their Competitions. The Parramatta Junior League endeavoured to provide you with the best possible Grand Final experience, and I hope your day was memorable.

Our Presentation Night at Doltone House Western Sydney was a celebration of the season. Thank you to all Clubs for your attendance on what was an enjoyable evening. We will look to tweak the night slightly to make it a must attend event each year. Congratulations goes to all the Award Winners.

On a personal note, I would like to thank Jim Sarantinos, Mark O'Neill and the rest of the Parramatta Eels staff for their help and support during the 2023 season, the Board of

Management of the Junior League for the passion they have for this District and for working with our staff for the betterment of Rugby League, our Advisory Committee Barry Guy, Shaine Flack, Shanna Mahony, Andrew Guan and Tina Bialluch for their time spent around the grounds and on varying Committee's during the season, the Junior League Staff Tina Bialluch, Tim Gray and Jan Bryen for their long hours of dedication to get their job done for our players and Clubs, the Parra Refs Committee, Coaches and active Referees for their contribution to the Junior League, Barry Ward, John, Grealy and Anne-Marie Poole from the Canterbury Bankstown District Junior Rugby League for their willingness to take on our initiatives across the Central West Conference League, Peter Clarke, Stuart Stanton and Nic Swan from the NSW Rugby League for their help and advice in conducting our Competitions, Marshal Boyd, Isaac Thompson and Kailey Thompson for the work they have undertaken across our catchment area as NRL Game Development Officers and to the Presidents & Secretaries of our affiliated Clubs who have loyally supported the Junior League Administration throughout the 2023 season.

Finally, a shout out to Barry Guy, a Life Member of both the Parramatta Junior Rugby League and the Parramatta Eels, Barry has advised he will not be standing for the Advisory Committee following 43 years of continuous service. The Parramatta Junior Rugby League thanks Barry for his dedicated service to our District, which included a stint in 1990 and 1991 in the chair of which I now sit.

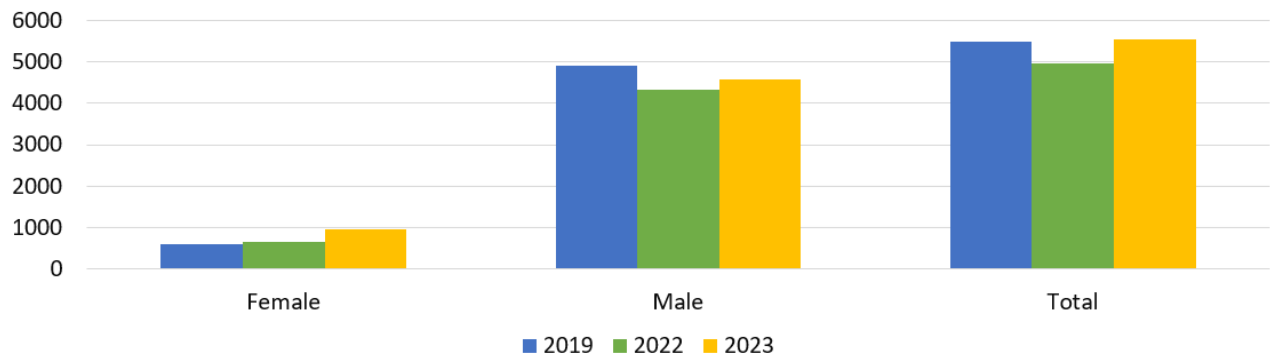
We look forward to welcoming our participants back and encouraging new players to join our game for a bigger and better season in 2024.

Registration numbers in the 2023 season saw an increase of 11.0% year on year and an increase in participation against the benchmark (pre-Covid) year of 2019.



Male participant numbers increased by 5.0 to in excess of 4,500 players. The aim is to increase numbers by a further 5% in 2024, with an aim to eclipse 5,000 male players by 2025.

Female participation continues to increase by large numbers year on year. This is due to the introduction of the NRLW Competition, many PJRL affiliated Clubs fielding League Tag Teams and the general promotion of Female Rugby League.

There was a 50.9% year on year increase in female player numbers in 2023 and with many more Clubs looking to field League Tag teams in 2024, female participation will no doubt continue to rise. The aim is to increase by 10% in 2024 and a further 10% in 2025, with an aim to have 1,200 female players by 2025.

The Junior League Association Yearbook proudly celebrates the incredible achievements of Rugby League across the Parramatta District, in 2023 the Parramatta Eels Elite Programs have been a part of this in the past year.

These programs have been instrumental in shaping the future stars, both Male and Female, of rugby league, and we extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Junior League clubs for their invaluable contributions.

Pathways to Excellence: First Steps of Development

Our journey begins with the Pathways teams for the Under 14 and Under 15 squads, where the focus was firmly on nurturing fundamentals and player development.

Under the guidance of the dedicated Joey Grima, these young talents honed their skills, culminating in thrilling games against the Wests Tigers and Central Coast Roosters during the July school holidays.

Summer 16's: A Taste of Representative Football

The Under 16 male program embarked on an exhilarating journey, participating in the "Summer 16's," offering them their inaugural taste of a representative program.

During the first half of the Junior Rep season, they squared off against formidable opponents, including the Sydney Roosters, North Sydney Bears, Penrith Panthers, and Manly Warringah Sea Eagles.

Lisa Fiaola Squad: Entertaining Display of Talent

The female Under 17 Lisa Fiaola squad showed their mettle, progressing from just a gala day in season 2022 to competing in four thrilling games, over the second half of the Junior Rep season.

They displayed their dominance against worthy adversaries, such as the Cronulla Sutherland Sharks, Manly Warringah Sea Eagles, Penrith Panthers, and Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs.

Junior Rep Teams: Rise to the Occasion

Our Junior Rep teams showcased their prowess throughout their 9 rounds of football.

The U17 Harold Matthews squad concluded the regular season in an impressive 3rd place, narrowly missing out on the Grand Final. They fought valiantly against the Newcastle Knights in a gripping Grand Final qualifier.

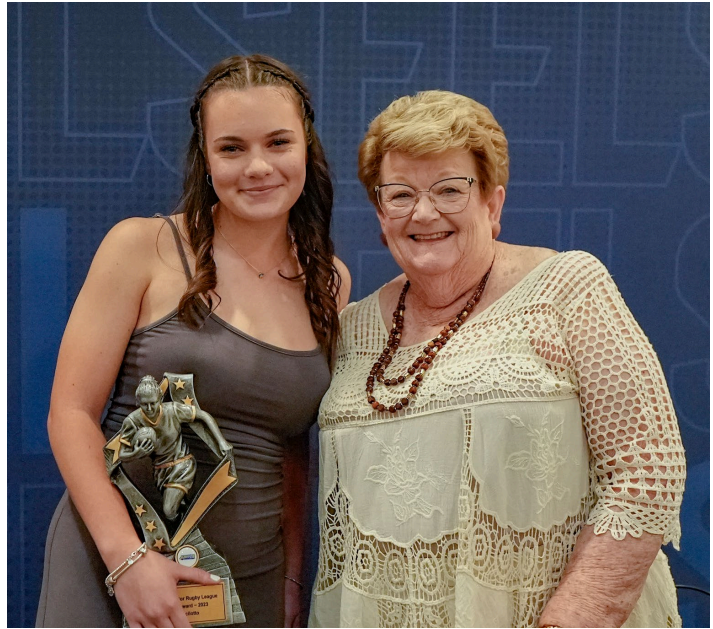

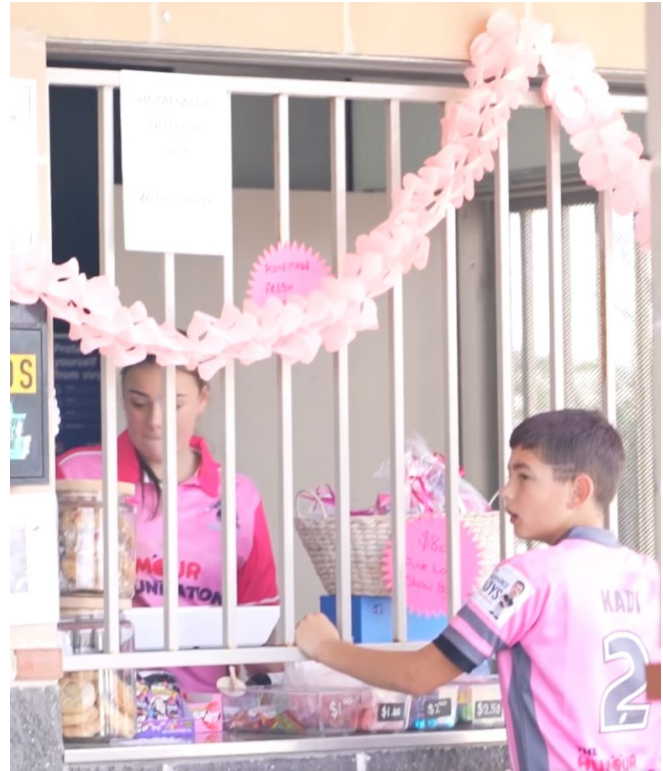
The U9/3s did a magnificent job to go through only losing 1 game to take out the premiership, well done Warren Flood and team.

Our club was happy to have three players represent their heritage playing in international games in their age group in 2023. We have been able to assist another talented young man towards his pathway of achieving his goals as he will be participating in the Sydney Shield Competition.

Our club's focus for 2023 was on player participation and further development on and off the field. We believe by achieving these small goals it will result in player retention, reaffirming the club's identity whilst increasing growth and interest within our club and community.

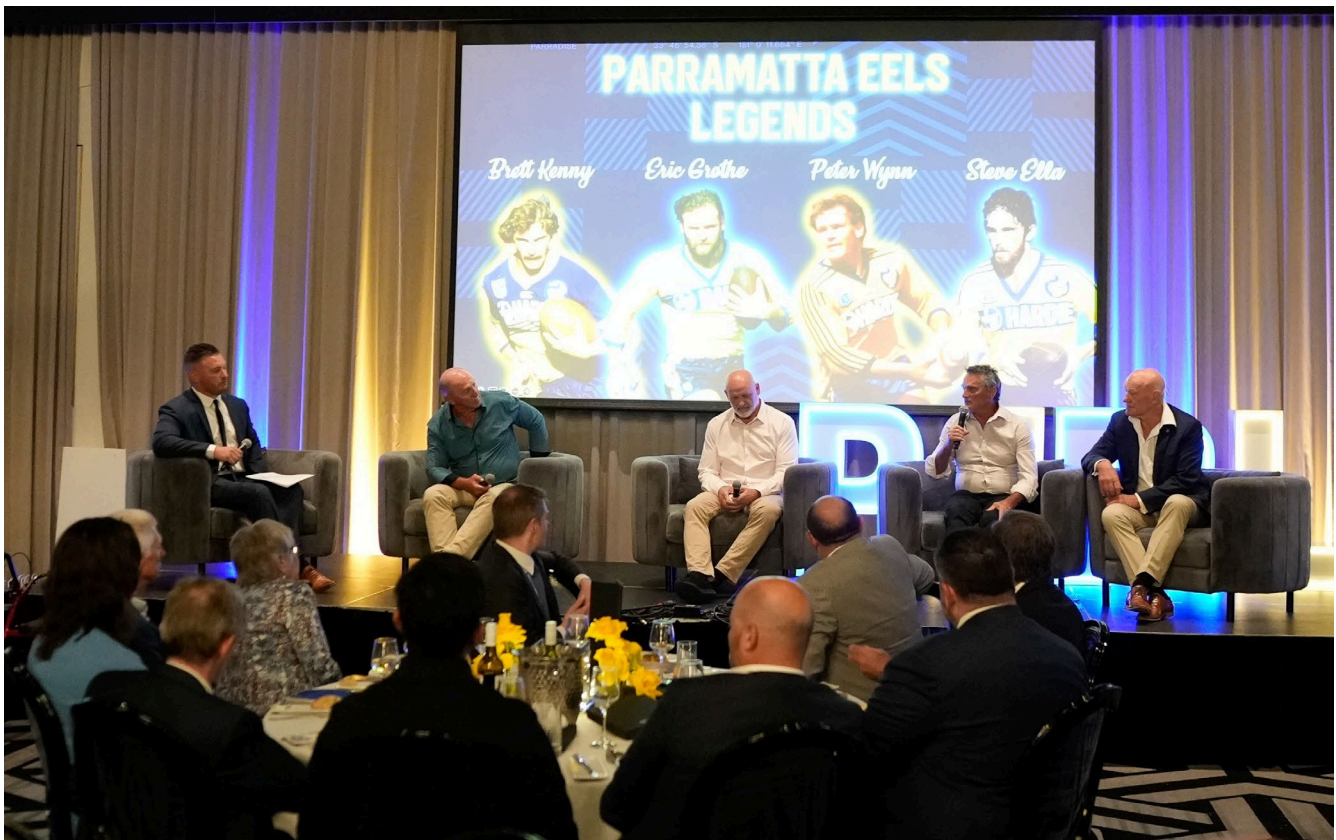
