CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

The 2024 season saw the Parramatta Junior District Rugby League build on the changes that we saw in 2023.

This year we focussed on the delivery of our strategic plan for future growth resulting in, registering a major milestone of over 5,600 registered players, reaching pre-Covid levels Enhanced digital content, including live-streamed matches, “Try of the Week” features, and Grand Final coverage with commentary.

Female participation has increased 97% since 2019, a key growth area for PJRL.

Live-streaming of female competitions (U14 to U18) introduced, highlighting players’ talents. We have continued to receive positive feedback from our Clubs on our renewed focus with respect to communication and governance with regular meetings with Board, Club Presidents and Secretaries to ensure transparency and collaboration.



This year also saw your Board together with our Clubs make a decision to remove our teams from the Central West Conference Competitions. This has been done to refocus on local player growth and to strengthen pathways within the Parramatta region. Feedback from our Clubs highlighted the importance of investing resources into the local district. With increasing participation, especially at the representative level, the focus will be on enhancing competition quality locally.

Our 2025 structure is under consultation with Clubs to refine operations based on feedback. We will continue to focus on player retention, attraction, and Club development for long-term sustainability.



Our season culminated in a fantastic Presentation Night held in the Grand Pavilion at Rosehill Racecourse. A wonderful evening for all of our Clubs. Thank you to everyone that attended and contributed to making the night a success. Congratulations to all those that were recognised during that evening, including importantly, each of our Volunteers of the year from all Clubs.

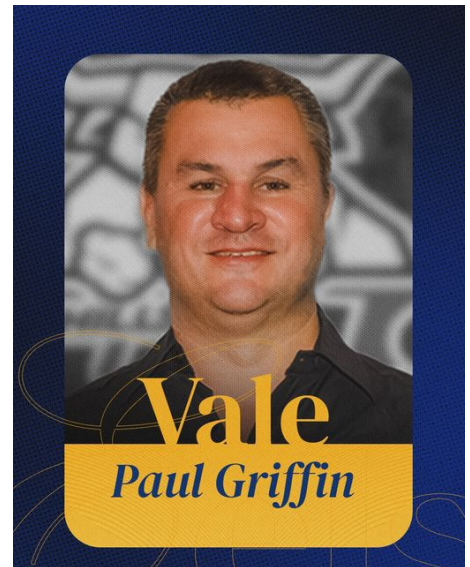
Again during 2024, during our ground visits, your Board witnessed strong competitions and also the great work undertaken by Club volunteers to the success of those competitions. Our competitions rely on the tireless efforts of those volunteers throughout our District. Can I again thank those volunteers for their continued efforts. Your Board will continue to support you in delivering outstanding competitions throughout 2025.

Congratulations to all those that competed during the season and to those Teams and Clubs who were successful in Grand Finals, Club Championships, plus those that gained representative honours and those that won individual Awards.

Can I also acknowledge that 2024 saw the senseless death of one of the stalwarts of the PDJL, of Paul Griffin, a devoted member of the Hills Bulls, major supporter of the PJRL, and the game of Rugby League in our community. Paul's passion for the sport, his unwavering dedication to the development of young players, and his selfless commitment to grassroots Rugby League have left a lasting legacy that will be felt for many years to come.



Can I conclude in thanking our Junior League Staff, General Manager Adam Fairley, Martina Bialluch, Tim Gray and Jan Bryen for all of their efforts in ensuring that the 2024 season was as the successful season it was.

In 2025 Jan Bryen is stepping down as a Board Member. Can I thank her on her very significant contribution to the PJRL over the past 23 years. She has worked selflessly over that time to ensure the success of our League and she will be missed.

Your Board looks forward to the continued positive collaboration with our member Clubs and a very successful 2025 season.

GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

2024 was another exceptional season for the Parramatta Junior Rugby League.

With respect to Board of Management changes Andrew Guan was elected at the 2023 AGM and Mat Picone was elected as the President of the Parramatta District Rugby League Referees Association and became their representative. Mat replaced Robert Morey as the Referees Association representative, and we thank him for his dedicated service to our District.

From a staff perspective, our team remained unchanged, Jan Bryen continued in her role as Junior League Administrator, Tina Bialluch in Junior League Operations and Tim Gray as Multimedia Coordinator.

The Parramatta Junior League has a united Board and Staff whose sole focus is to deliver the best Competition and Experience possible for our stakeholders.

Our year started as it has traditionally for many seasons with the Under 6s Fun Day at CommBank Stadium. The day is a wonderful experience for the kids and their parents inside the inner sanctum of the Parramatta Eels.



With the presenting of a jersey, a change room tour, meet and greet with NRL and NRLW stars, a run out onto the hollowed turf while being clapped on by Club representatives, followed by on field skills drills and finally jumping castles and face painting, it is truly an eye opener for new participants.

In 2024 we continued to work in line with the recommendations from the 2022 Gemba Report into the administration of the Junior League and we will undertake a review of where we were and where we now are and we may make certain changes based on our findings.

In March we teamed up with Western Sydney University and conducted Coaching Leadership Sessions with Coaches of Under 13 to Under 15 Teams, focusing on the prevention of on and off field violence and we also held Mental Health First Aid Courses through Ripple Effect Wellbeing to provide all Clubs with the skills to provide initial support to their membership and to provide advice about the services available to them.



There was buy in across the Parramatta Eels for these initiatives with Parramatta Eels General Manager Football Mark O'Neill, Parramatta Junior Rugby League Ambassador Nathan Cayless, Parramatta Eels Wellbeing Manager David Gower and NRL Player Shaun Lane all involved in the Coaching Leadership program.

We worked hard during the year to best promote our players and Clubs, and we were able to achieve great results through several initiatives.

The Under 16 Division 1 Male Match of the Round Livestream continued and was joined by a Female Match of the Round Livestream which featured Parramatta Clubs in the U14 to U18 age groups.

The livestreams were embraced by all Teams involved. The initial media day, our game days, the after-match interviews were all undertaken in an enthusiastic and professional manner.

We would like to thank all Clubs, coaches & players in the competition for making the promotion of our Junior League best in class.



No matter how good the product is on the field you need accomplished commentators to describe what is happening. Lewis Shepperd was back to commentate our Under 16 Male games, while Greg Hayes joined us to call the Female Match of the Round.

Their passion for rugby league, willingness to learn about each individual player, including how to pronounce their names and their regular communication with coaches shone through in our broadcasts and in the after game interviews.

Our other social media initiatives provided wide ranging content across many age groups in the District. Under 16s, Female and Sunday U17s to U21s Highlights, the Try of the Week, Little League Legends, Around The Grounds and Throwback Thursdays promoted and engaged our membership.



Our NRL and NRLW players visited our Clubs in two separate segments over the year. We thank the players for their time engaging with our Junior League Clubs, Coaches and Players.



At the Round 6 home game at CommBank Stadium the Parramatta Eels hosted a Junior League Takeover. Each of our Clubs were represented by a flag bearer and five player representatives. This was a great showcase of our Junior League and the kids enjoyed the

experience in front of a big Friday night home crowd.

Throughout the course of the season our Junior League Clubs were provided the opportunity for their Mini & Mod teams to play at half time on the turf at CommBank Stadium. This is a great thrill for the players involved to play on the Stadium surface and to play in front of a large and vocal crowd who really gets into the spirit when our teams are playing.



We are blessed in the Parramatta Junior League that four of our Clubs conduct all abilities programs. We will have a continued focus in our registration campaigns on making families aware that these opportunities exist within our Association and we will continue to work with our NRL Game Development Officers to promote the program in schools.

We thank Wentworthville United, Hills Bulls, Mounties and Greystanes for their support of all abilities players.

During the Finals Series' we were out and about interviewing our Minor Premiers and getting some vision of their training sessions. We thank all Clubs and teams for participating in this initiative and thanks to those Clubs that moved team training sessions so that multiple Minor Premiers from their Club trained on the same ground at the same time.

From a Governance perspective we continued to work on implementing the Goals and Targets of our Strategic Plan and worked with Clubs to ensure they are compliant with modern Community Club standards.

The Junior League received monetary support from Parramatta Leagues through ClubsGrants Funding. The funds received pay for a range of initiatives including Player and Club Insurance, Referees Fees and the Coaching of Junior Referees and a Registration Rebate for families with 2 or more registered players 17 years or under living under the same roof. This contribution of just under \$450,000 reduces an individual players cost to play and these amounts effectively stay in the pockets of our Clubs, which allows them to purchase their own equipment and undertake other Club functions.

We thank Parramatta Leagues Club President Greg Monaghan and his fellow Directors and Chief Executive Officer Chris Dimou and his staff for their valued contribution to our Junior League.



Trivett Subaru Sydney are also a major sponsor of the Parramatta Junior League, supplying a car for a raffle the last three seasons which has seen in excess of \$110,000 received by our local Clubs. We thank Renee Pappas and the rest of the team for their valued contribution.

I would like to thank our Presidents, Secretaries and Club Committees for all of the work they undertook with their Clubs in the 2024 season. The added position of a Member Protection Information Officer and the need for Clubs with teams aged 13 years and over to have their matches recorded on a VEO Unit required extra work during the season and we thank Clubs for their compliance with these functions.



On the park our registration numbers increased again year on year. We had just over 5,600 players registered. While our male participation numbers are still building up to 2019 levels our female registrations are continuing to prosper. This season we had a record 1,175 female players, which is an increase of 97% since 2019.

The Junior League will continue to work with Clubs to introduce female participants to our game whether it be through traditional tackle competitions or League Tag and this strategy has been embraced by many Clubs across the District.

This season we had 217 teams aged U6 to U12 across our Saturday and Sunday Competitions and 143 teams aged 13 and older across our Tackle and League Tag Competitions. Those teams played in over 2,000 games either in local, conference or metro competitions (the total number of games in 2024 being decreased due to three full washout rounds).

We thank those that set up the grounds, served in the canteen on roster, cooked the BBQ, acted as Ground Managers, drove their kids to training and the games or volunteered their spare hours to coaching, managing or being a trainer.



Congratulations to all our competitive teams who won their Competitions. The Parramatta Junior League endeavoured to provide you with the best possible Grand Final experience, and we hope your day was memorable.



Our Presentation Night in the Rosehill Racecourse Grand Pavilion was a celebration of the season. Thank you to all Clubs for your attendance on what was an enjoyable evening.

We will look to tweak the night slightly to make it a must attend event each year. Congratulations goes to all the Award Winners.

On a personal note, I would like to thank Jim Sarantinos, Mark O'Neill and the rest of the Parramatta Eels staff for their help and support during the 2024 season, the Board of Management of the Junior League for the passion they have for this District and for working with our staff for the betterment of Rugby League, our Advisory Committee Shaine Flack, Shanna Mahony and Tina Bialluch for their time spent around the grounds and on varying Committee's during the season, the Junior League Staff Tina Bialluch, Tim Gray and Jan Bryen for their long hours of dedication to get their job done for our players and Clubs, the Parra Refs Committee, Coaches and active Referees for their contribution to the Junior League, John Grealy and Anne-Marie Poole from the Canterbury Bankstown District Junior Rugby League for their willingness to take on our initiatives across the Central West Conference League, Peter Clarke, Stuart Stanton and Nic Swan from the NSW Rugby League for their help and advice in conducting our Competitions, Marshal Boyd, D'Arcy Hardman and Liam Castell-Brown for the work they have undertaken across our catchment area as NRL Game Development Officers and to the Presidents & Secretaries of our affiliated Clubs who have loyally supported the Junior League Administration throughout the 2024 season.



Finally, a shout out to Jan Bryen, who has advised that she will not be continuing on the Parramatta Junior Rugby League Board of Directors.

Jan was the recipient of both the Eels Women In League Award and NSWRL Volunteer of the Year award in 2011, the Michael Cronin Award Club Person of the Year Award in 2014 and in 2017 she became and remains the only female Life Member of the Parramatta Eels.

She has worked, on a strictly volunteer basis, throughout her distinguished Rugby League career, in multiple roles:

- General Committee of Fairfield Patrician Brothers JRLFC, then as Assistant Secretary and then Secretary for the Club, culminating in Life Membership in 2000
- Parramatta Junior Rugby League Club Advisory Committee Member, before going on to be Assistant Secretary from 2001 to 2005 then Treasurer from 2006 to 2022, culminating in Life Membership of the Parramatta Junior Rugby League and the Parramatta District Convents Rugby League Association.

For the past 13 years, Jan has volunteered in the Junior League Office as the Junior League Assistant.

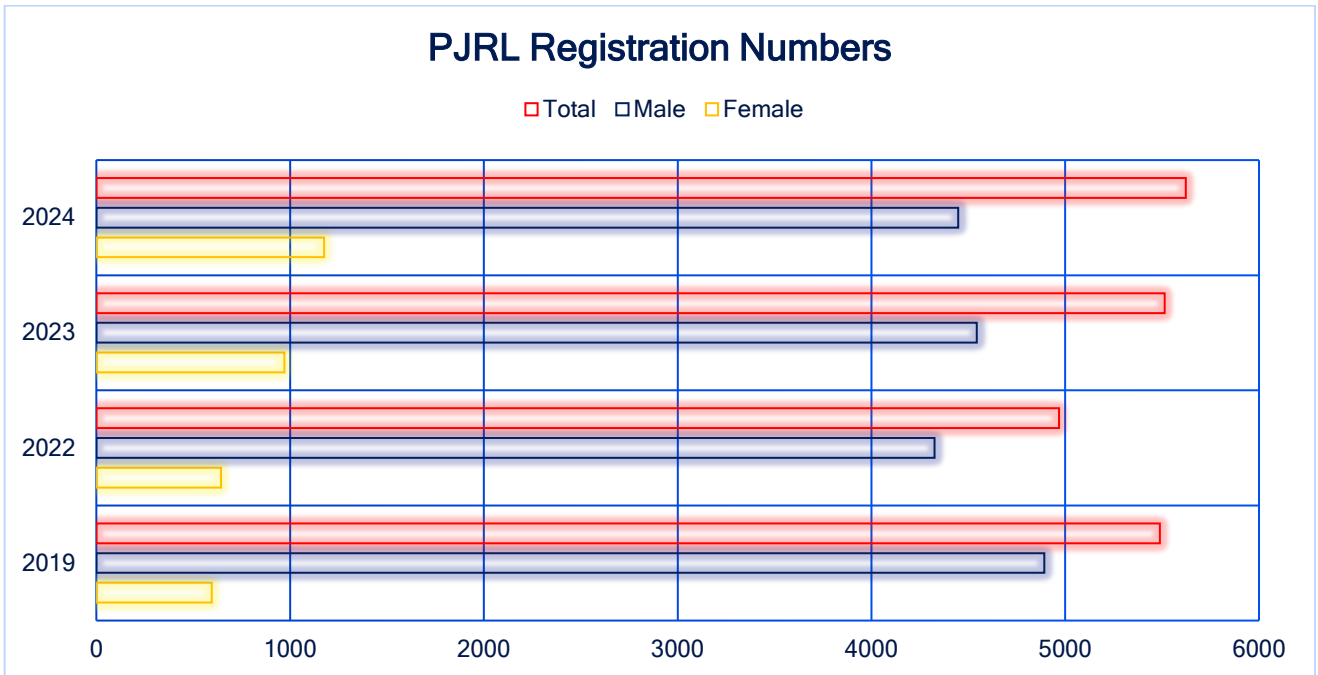
A stalwart of the Parramatta Junior Rugby League, Jan Bryen is engrained in our folklore.

Registration numbers in the 2024 season saw an increase of 2.0% year on year and an increase in participation against the benchmark (pre-Covid) year of 2019.

Male participant numbers decreased by 2.1% to under 4,500 players. With a withdrawal from the Central West Conference, it is hoped that retention for the 2025 season will increase, with an aim is to grow numbers by 5% in 2025, with an aim to register 4,700 male players in 2025.

Female participation continues to increase by large numbers year on year. This is due to the introduction of the NRLW Competition, many PJRL affiliated Clubs fielding League Tag Teams and the general promotion of Female Rugby League.

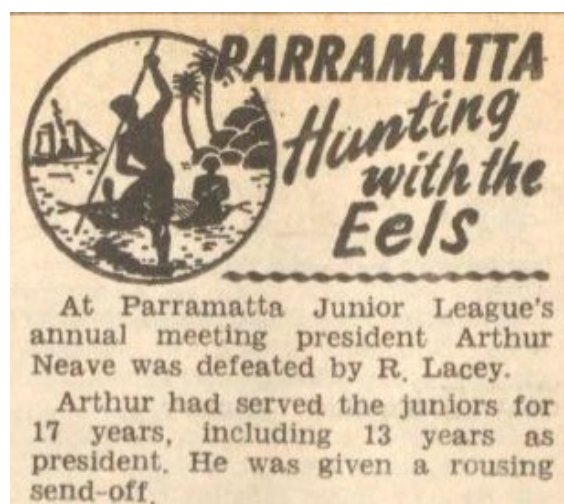
There was a 21.1% year on year increase in female player numbers in 2024 and with many more Clubs looking to field League Tag teams in 2025, female participation will no doubt continue to rise. The aim is to increase by a further 20% over the next 2 seasons, with an aim to have 1,400 female players by 2026.

Parramatta Eels Elite Programs Make Waves in 2024! The Parramatta District Junior League Association proudly reflects on another remarkable year for rugby league, with the Parramatta Eels Elite Programs shining brightly throughout the 2024 season.

Developing Future Stars: Expanding Opportunities for Young Athletes

This year marked a milestone with the introduction of a female development program, supporting talented players aged 14, 15, 16, and 18 for the first time in the district. This initiative demonstrated our commitment to nurturing both male and female pathways, helping cultivate the next generation of rugby league athletes.

Pathways to Success: Building Foundations in Youth Development

Our journey with the Under 14 and Under 15 squads remained focused on fundamental skills and foundational player growth. 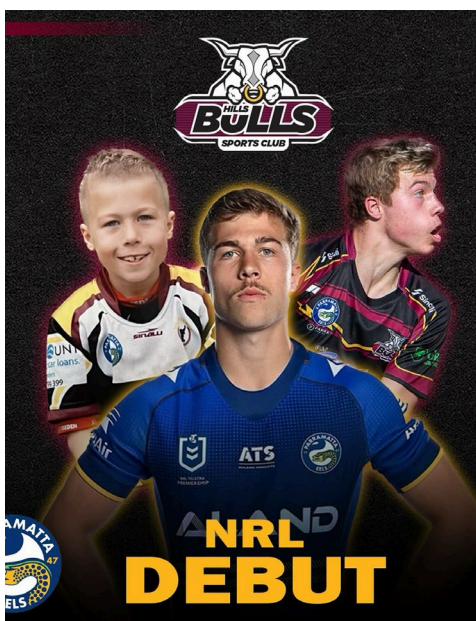

Senior Rugby League

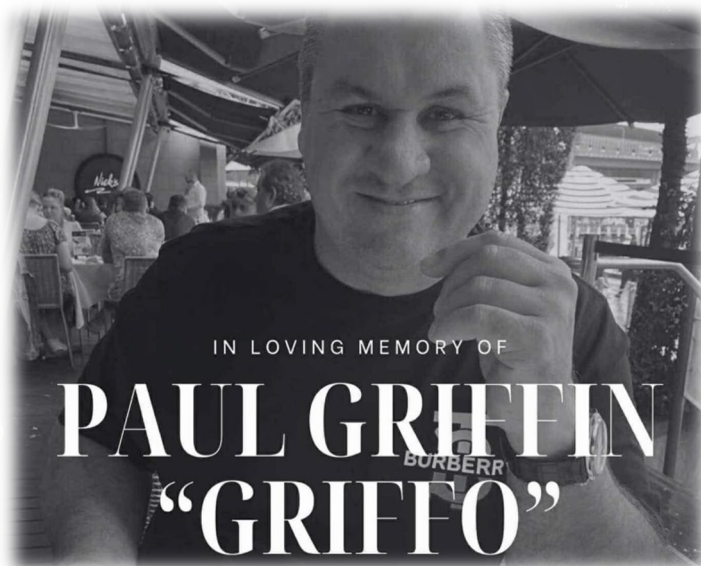

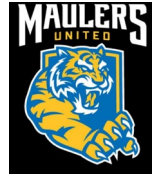
